2/3/2022

12 p.m. - Update from the Snow Team: " We are shutting down snow ops as of 12 pm this afternoon. All red routes are in good shape, blue routes are in decent condition and have all been salted. Hopefully this afternoon's sun will assist in continuing melting.

We are addressing ice removal requests on non-plow route streets.

This afternoon, we are prepping equipment to remove as much ice and snow as possible in the Olde Town area. This will be a full crew working the graveyard shift tonight."

9 a.m. - Just a friendly reminder to Arvada residents that the [Arvada Municipal Code](#) requires that snow, ice and slush be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours after the end of a snowfall.

4 a.m. - Update from the Snow Team: "We are deploying 10 trucks this morning at 4 a.m. to get a head start on clean up and ice control.

2/2/2022

4 p.m. - Update from the Snow Team: "We are continuing snow and ice removal this evening, we have a full crew out on the roads."

8:10 a.m. - Update from the Snow Team: "We are continuing snow and ice removal this morning and have a full crew out on the roads."

6:30 a.m. - City of Arvada trash and recycling collection is on a one-day delay due to the storm. All routes scheduled to run on WEDNESDAY 2/2 will now be run on THURSDAY 2/3.
